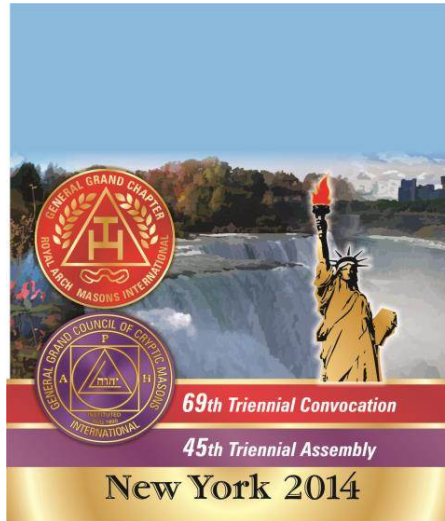

Welcome and Introduction

On behalf of the Convention Committee of General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons International and General Grand Council Cryptic Masons International, we extend our sincerest greetings and welcome to all of the participants and delegates to this Triennial Convention.

Our Committee has worked diligently to host a world class convention and destination worthy of your consideration and participation. We are eager for you to review the accompanying itinerary and schedule of events which will aid you in your preparations as a delegate to this convention.

## Overview of the Triennial Tours and Outside Entertainment

The “Triennial Convention Program” actually begins a few days prior to the formal opening of both General Grand Bodies in order to offer time for you to tour and experience the unique and wonderful attractions indigenous to the Western New York Region.

We have selected two professionally run tours preceding the convention.

The first tour is scheduled Friday September 26, 2014 with a 9:00AM-4:00PM trip to the spectacular Niagara Falls considered one of the Natural Wonders of the World. (USside only-no passport needed).

The second tour is scheduled Saturday, September 27, 2014 with a 9:00AM-4:00PM trip touring the wonderful and historical sites in and around the City of Buffalo; which during the Pan Am Exposition was declared to be “the Paris of North America”. The City of Buffalo is also the terminus of the famous Erie Canal.

The Adam’s Mark Hotel is within walking distance of the Buffalo and Erie County Naval & Military Park and museum on the shore of Lake Erie and offer for tour, several decommissioned US Naval vessels, including the Cleveland-class cruiser USS Little Rock, the Fletcher-class destroyer USS The Sullivans, and the submarine USS Croaker are open to the public for tours.

Located a short distance beyond the Naval Park is the new 130 Million Dollar Seneca Buffalo Creek Casino and entertainment complex for your enjoyment.

## Special Conferral of Degrees

### Super Excellent Master Degree and Dinner

### General Grand High Priest to confer Holy Royal Arch Degree and Table Chapter

On Saturday evening, September 27, 2014, The Royal Arch Degree will be conferred on pre-qualified candidates with Most Excellent Edmund D. Harrison, General Grand High Priest and Past Master of Independent Royal Arch Lodge No. 2 in the East, conferring the Degree in Ancient form. We will have a Table Chapter (between sections of the degree) in conjunction with the degree starting at 6:00PM.

Note: All Candidates must be pre-qualified. Any Chapter may propose a candidate.

Attached with this overview is an application form that must be sent directly to Christopher L. Allen, the Registrar of the conferring organizations. All of the information necessary to receive the degrees is contained within the form. Candidates must have attained the rank of Most Excellent Master in order to qualify to receive the Holy Royal Arch Degree. All Royal Arch Companions are most welcome and encouraged to attend, dine and be a part of this historic occasion.

### Parade to the Erie Canal, Wedding of the Waters Ceremony and Opening Ceremonies of the Triennial

## Erie Canal and Parade and Wedding of the Waters

In 1825 General Grand High Priest Most Excellent DeWitt Clinton, who was also New York's governor, stood on the deck of a packet boat and poured a barrel of water from Lake Erie into the Atlantic Ocean. This "wedding of the waters," as it came to be known, was the symbolic completion of the Erie Canal, the most important waterway of its day and the engineering project that once and for all sealed New York City's future as the most important commercial city in America.

To commemorate this important event, The General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International, with New York's own Most Excellent Edmund D. Harrison officiating, will march to the Erie Canal from the Adam's Mark Hotel and perform a symbolic "wedding of the waters" ceremony at the recently rediscovered and beautifully restored Commercial Slip of the Erie Canal.

We will assemble in full regalia in the hotel parking lot at 9:00AM and parade to the Erie Canal commencing at 9:30AM. Capitular ceremonies will begin as soon as we arrive at the Canal Ste. This parade is open to the public and many government officials and dignitaries will be a part of the procession. It promises to be one of the most spectacular Masonic events of the triennial.

## Opening Ceremonies of the Triennial

On Sunday, September 28, 2014, 1:00PM we will officially convene the Joint- Public Opening of the Triennial. The event opens up with an impressive "Parade of Flags" with each jurisdiction proudly carrying their respective State or Country Flag to the Grand East. Companion Donald Leo Mc Andrews, appearing in full costume as Ben Franklin will present an inspirational address to the audience. There will be formal introductions of dignitaries, welcomes, and proclamations and ending with a Memorial Service at 3:30PM.

## Hotel Information

The Adam's Mark Hotel is the official headquarters / hotel for the 2014 Triennial. The hotel is located at 120 Church Street, Buffalo, NY 14202, (716) 845-5100. It is important to understand that the hotel is located on the Lake Erie waterfront and is not situated in the downtown Buffalo area. There are few hotels or restaurants within a reasonable walking distance; therefore we strongly recommend that you reserve your meals etc. with the Triennial Committee.

### Parking

As part of the convention courtesies, the hotel is providing complimentary parking service in their garage ramps. You will receive a parking pass upon check in with the front desk. There is

taxi service available between the Buffalo Niagara International Airport and the Adam's Mark Hotel.

### Shuttle Service

The Adam's Mark Hotel (716) 845-5100 - is offering limited shuttle service between the Buffalo Niagara International Airport and the Adam's Mark Hotel. The shuttle will be available to take you to the hotel on the peak arrival date of Thursday, September 25, 2014 & Friday, September 26, 2014 from the hours of 2:00PM-10:00PM. The shuttle will then be available to take you to the airport on Wednesday October 1, 2014 from 6:00AM-2:00PM.

## Registration Procedures

The 2014 Triennial participants can register directly with the hotel via internet or telephone. The name of the group is **2014 Royal Arch/Cryptic Triennial**. The room registration deadline is September 4, 2014. After this date, rooms or rates cannot be guaranteed.

Cancellations must be made 24 hours prior to arrival date to avoid any fees.

Buffalo-Niagara Falls metropolitan area. The airport serves Buffalo, Niagara Falls, Western New York and Canada. Many Canadians find good deals when booking passage through the Buffalo-Niagara International Airport facility. This is an international airport and has government custom agents. Buffalo, New York is on a major flyway for those travelling internationally to the Triennial. Passports and travel visas may be required to/from foreign jurisdictions.
